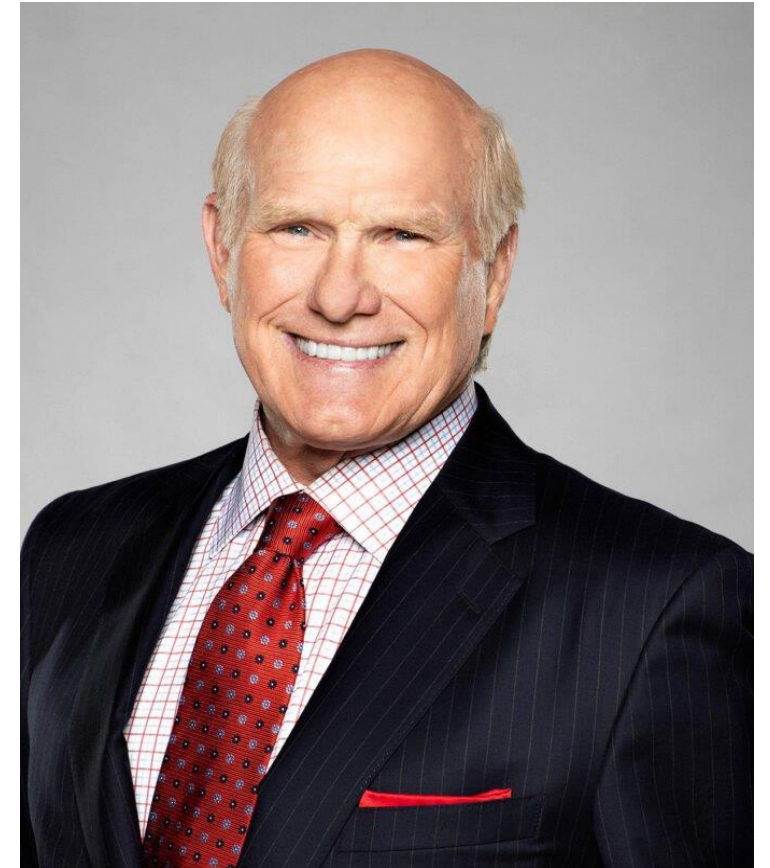

About William Taylor and Jim Berlin:

Ambassador William B. Taylor is a distinguished fellow with the Atlantic Council's Eurasia Center and a veteran diplomat with extensive experience in international affairs and conflict regions. He served as U.S. Ambassador to Ukraine from 2006 to 2009 and again as chargé d'affaires in Kyiv from 2019 to 2020. Throughout his career, Taylor has led U.S. assistance and reconstruction efforts in the Middle East, Iraq, Afghanistan, Eastern Europe, and former Soviet states, including key roles during the Arab Spring. Before joining the Atlantic Council, he served as vice president for Europe and Russia at the United States Institute of Peace. A graduate of United States Military Academy and Harvard Kennedy School, he also served as a U.S. Army officer in Vietnam and Germany.

Jim Berlin is the founder and CEO of Logistics Plus, which he launched in 1996 with three employees and a single contract after a 20-year career in the trucking industry. Under his leadership, the company has grown into a global supply chain provider serving more than 2,000 customers with approximately 1,000 employees in 30 countries and nearly \$500 million in annual revenue. A passionate advocate for Erie, Berlin has invested significantly in the city's revitalization, including the restoration of Union Station as the company's headquarters, and has been recognized with numerous honors, including Entrepreneur of the Year.

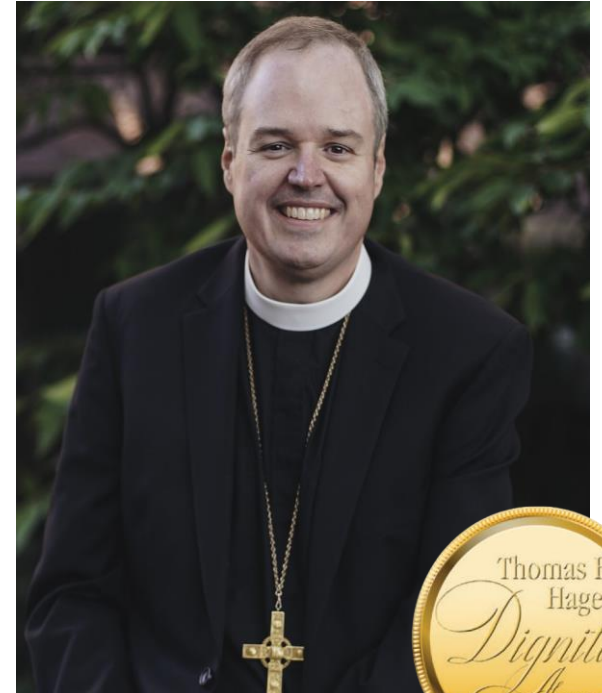


Bishop Sean W. Rowe: 28th Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church

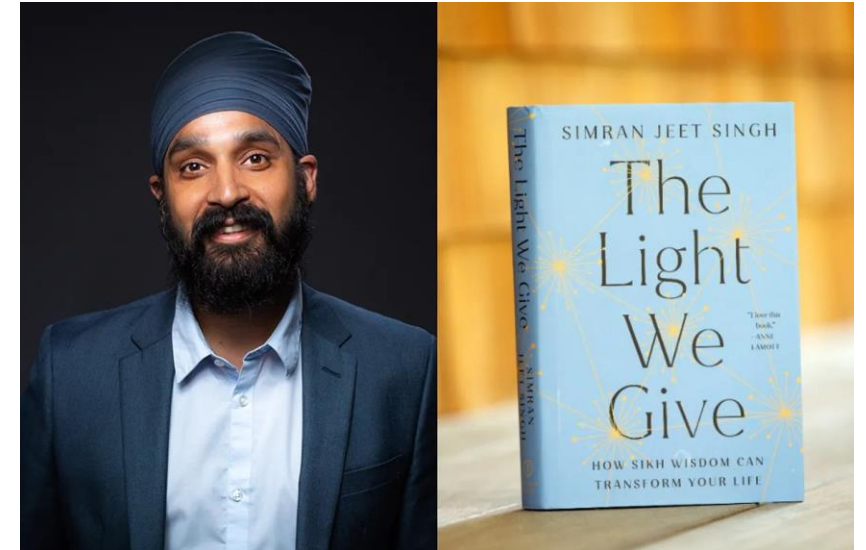

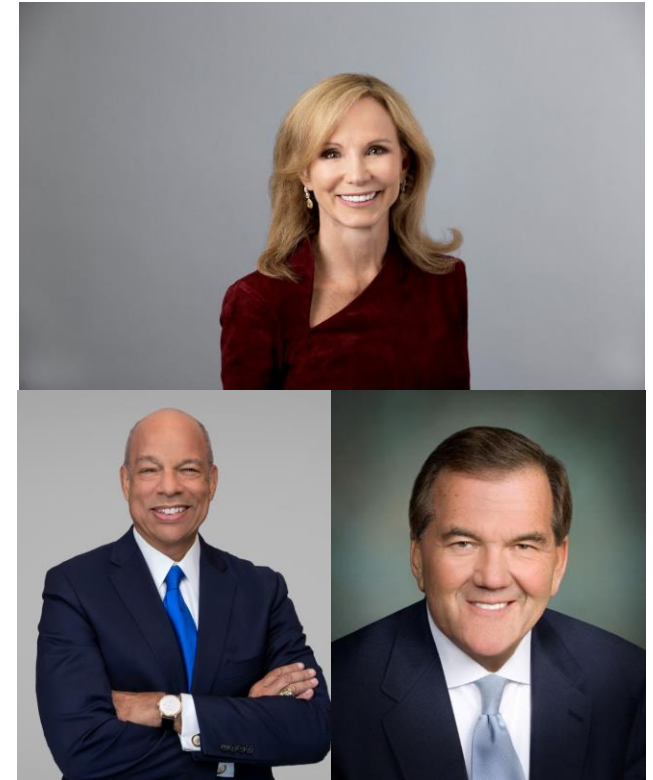


America's Homeland Security: 25-Years After 9/11

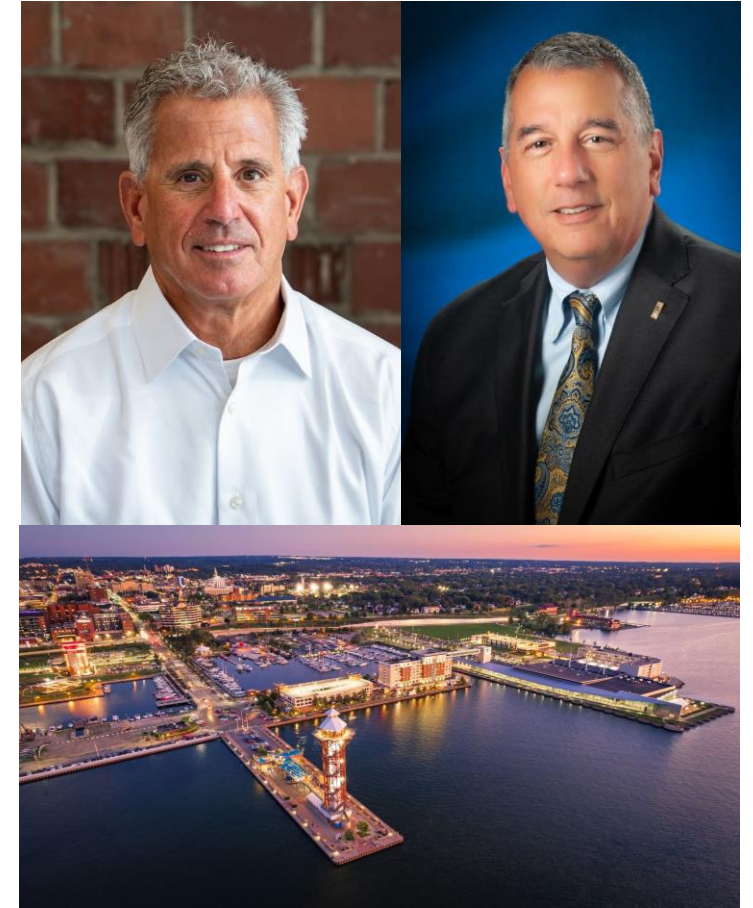
Looking Back While Forging Ahead: Examining Erie's Economic Development

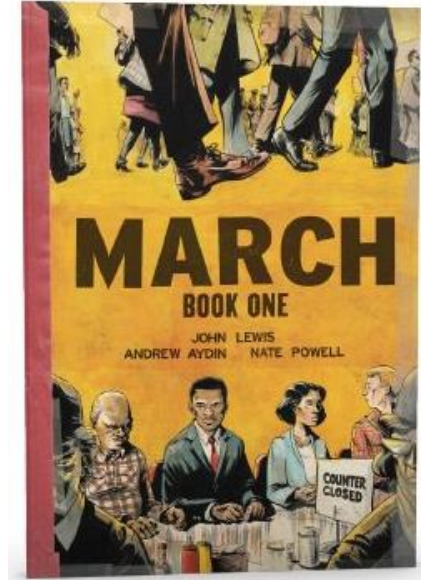


"March, Run, Vote: Graphic Storytelling and the Fight for Democracy"

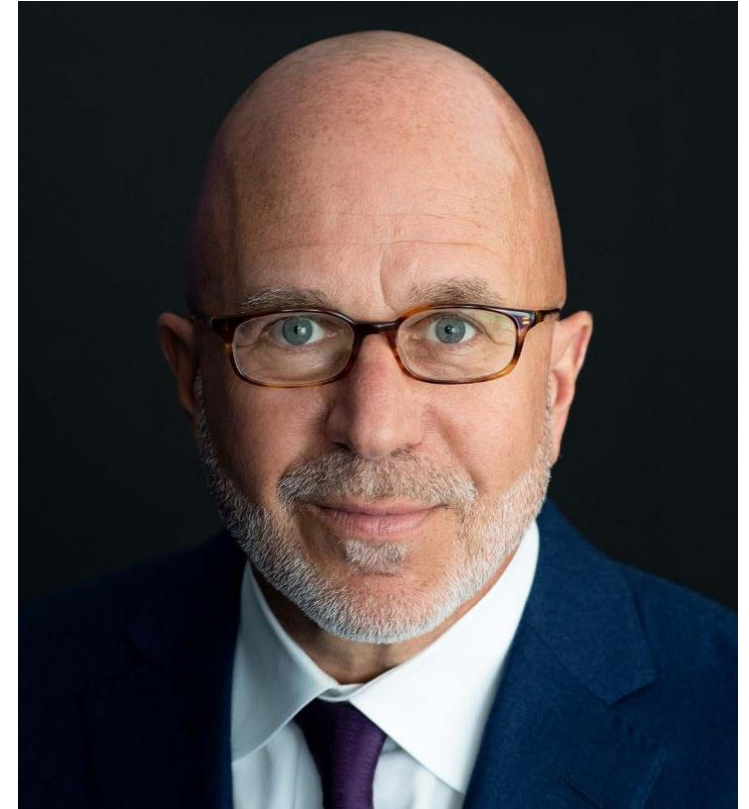

Ms. Hoover has served in The White House under President George W. Bush, in the Department of Homeland Security, on Capitol Hill and on two presidential campaigns. She is the President of American Unity Fund; a political organization focused on achieving full freedom and equality for LGBT Americans. A bestselling author, her writing has appeared in The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, The New York Daily News, The Daily Beast, CNN.com and FoxNews.com.

Ms. Hoover serves on the boards of Stanford University's Hoover Institution, the Hoover Presidential Foundation, the Belgian American Educational Foundation, The Markle Foundation, and Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty. Raised in Colorado, Hoover has lived in China, Mexico, Bolivia, and Taiwan, speaks fluent Spanish, and studied Mandarin Chinese.

A staff writer at *The Atlantic* and a Senior Fellow at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies, her work illuminates the fragility of liberal democracy.



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
