History Brought to Life - A Series of Events with Thomas Jefferson, Abigail Adams, and Betsy Ross

Tuesday, Feb. 10 through Thursday, Feb. 12

Join the world-class performers and educators from the American Historical Theatre, as they entertain, educate, and inspire by bringing to life Thomas Jefferson, Abigail Adams, and Betsy Ross! Together, Jefferson and Adams will explore their friendship and politics in a spirited debate on women's rights, Shays' Rebellion, sedition, immigration, presidential powers, supreme court appointments, and other issues. In additional events, Jefferson will offer his insights on the political divides of the nation leading up to and through the election of 1800 and what "all men are created equal" means 250 years later; Adams will expound on her famous imploring to "remember the ladies!"; and Ross will unfurl the story of the American flag.

Registrants are welcomed – and encouraged – but not required to attend the entire series to enjoy and learn from individual events.

Did you know that in addition to in-person, virtual, and hybrid events, the JES offers courses? Returning in 2026 are both the weekly course, "Great Conversations," in which participants read a range of materials – from the classics to notable contemporary works – and "Great Decisions," a bi-monthly course in partnership with the Foreign Policy Association, in which participants dive into critical, global issues with national- and local-level implications. Political science professor, national security expert, and JES Scholar-in-Residence Diane Chido and former Foreign Service Officer and JES Scholar-in-Residence Christine Riehl guide "Great Decisions," of which two sections are being offered, and JES Trustee Bill Koehle facilitates "Great Conversations," of which one section is being offered.

New in 2026: The JES will offer a five-part course, "A History of Rivalry Between US Presidents and the Supreme Court of the United States." As course instructor George Deutsch, historian, educator, and Executive Director Emeritus of the Erie County Historical Society, notes: History proves virtually nothing is new – prologue informs the present. Today's spotlight on controversies both with and between the Presidency and the Supreme Court often scream from the headlines.

This course will examine the long history of rivalry between Presidents and the Court over a series of five lectures. Contentious cases will be reviewed from Dred Scott through Plessey to Presidential Immunity (Trump v United States 7/1/2024).

"A History of Rivalry Between US Presidents and the Supreme Court of the United States" begins Wednesday, Feb. 25 and runs through Wednesday, March 25, and will be held at 3 p.m. at the JES.
