Dr. Camille Busette, a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, joins Brookings Fellow Dr. Rashawn Ray to discuss the need for public policy reform and racial equity in America.

After receiving her academic training at the University of California at Berkeley and the University of Chicago, Dr. Busette embarked on a career at the World Bank, where she confronted issues of extreme poverty, lack of access to health, education, sanitation, and the labor market. She now heads the Race, Prosperity, and Inclusion initiative at Brookings.

Dr. Ray, a professor of Sociology and executive director of the Lab for Applied Social Science Research (LASSR) at the University of Maryland in College Park, is a David M. Rubenstein Fellow at Brookings. He is a prolific writer and author, having published more than 50 books, articles, and op-eds.

Dr. Busette is also a friend to the Jefferson, having appeared several times in Jefferson programs, including a digital presentation in 2020 and 2019's Global Summit when she discussed new approaches to addressing race and belonging. She is currently working as a project consultant with Erie-based advocacy groups on a new policy strategy titled "Race, Prosperity, and Inclusion."

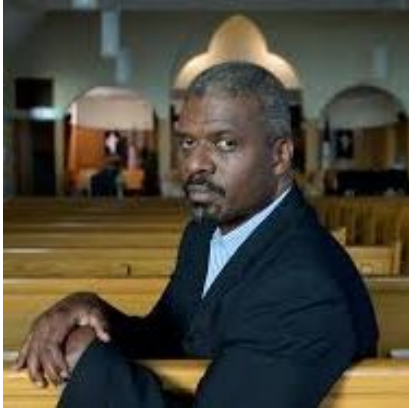

Read About Rev. Jeffrey Brown

Rev. Brown, a Baptist minister, has for years helped cities and police departments across the



country address youth violence and develop plans to make communities safer and fairer. Today those stakes are as great as they have ever been.

That’s the backdrop of Rev. Brown’s discussion of race and his current project to convene a second national conference of faith leaders and law enforcement and hold a national conversation on the importance of faith institutions in public safety.

Rev. Brown, who has presented to the Jefferson several times, including in 2020, was a central figure in the “Boston Miracle,” which succeeded in significantly lowering youth crime and gang violence in Boston’s most troubled neighborhoods. His message of working within stressed communities rather than from an authority perspective has resonated with people of all faiths, races, and occupations. Famously, he once said he learned some of his most important life lessons, not in the “hallowed halls of a seminary,” but from drug dealers, prostitutes, and gang members.

He is co-founder of the Boston Ten Point Coalition, the group that inspired a 79 percent drop in violent crime in the 1990s.
